

## From the Chief Executive Officer

Grand Strand Water & Sewer Authority experienced stronger growth during the 2014 fiscal year, adding 2,259 customers and bringing our total customers served to over 80,000. These increases are a result of a healthier local economy, which produced a significant rise in new housing and commercial accounts.

Grand Strand Water & Sewer Authority's service area consists of 1,123 square miles and encompasses Horry County as well as parts of Georgetown, Marion, Dillon and Columbus counties. This fiscal year, GSWSA delivered 14.98 billion gallons of water to its customers, an increase of 7.4 percent and treated 10.64 billion gallons of wastewater representing an 8.1 percent increase over fiscal year 2013.


Major capital improvements in 2014 included \$20 million dollars for the 5 MGD (million gallons per day) Bucksport Wastewater Treatment Plant and composting facilities. More than \$4.6 million dollars was invested for the installation of a 30" water line from Highway 501 to International Drive, providing additional water volume and pressure to the Carolina Forest, North Myrtle Beach and Little River service areas. GSWSA also initiated the construction of utility relocations for several major SCDOT highway improvement projects with \$3.3 million invested. Additionally, GSWSA spent \$3.2 million on the Rural Water and Sewer program to extend water and sewer lines into unincorporated communities throughout Horry County.

Grand Strand Water & Sewer Authority is committed to efficiently delivering reliable, high quality water and providing exceptional service today while planning to meet the needs of our communities tomorrow. We are pleased to present this Annual Report for the 2014 fiscal year. From the entire staff and Board of Directors, it is a privilege to serve you.






















## **Financial Summary for 2014**




# Total Assets and Liabilities


During FY 2014, total assets increased by \$14.0 million and exceeded liabilities by \$466.8 million.

Operating revenue was up \$5.3 million over last year, an increase of 7.57%.






#### **Total Revenue**

Total revenue was up by \$4.6 million over FY 2013.




#### **Total Assets**

### Typical Residential Bill

GSWSA rates are among the lowest in the region. The typical residential monthly water and sewer bill based on an average of 8,000 gallons in 2000 was \$34.19 For FY 2014, the same typical monthly bill was \$44.76.
